# RVE Touch Rugby 2019

After spring break, Rose Valley will be competing in the co-ed elementary touch rugby league with both grade 4 and grade 5 students. The touch rugby team will be coached by Mrs. Wark and Mr. Worrall.

**Pre-season touch rugby will be run in two formats:**

**1. Indoor, drop-in, skill introduction on March 4, 6, 11, and 13th (2:30 – 4:00 pm)**

- For those that wish to prepare for the season and experience the sport.
- Students are free to attend these sessions at their discretion.

**2. Outdoor, team practices on April 2, 3, 8, 9, 10, 15, 16, and 17th (2:30 – 4:00 pm)**

- It is recommended that students wear cleats and appropriate clothing for outdoor practices.
- Once the league is scheduled, we will be travelling to compete against other schools in the district.
- When a schedule is available, it will be forwarded to you with the appropriate consent forms.
- Anticipate touch rugby to be happening on Mondays (practice), Tuesdays (practice), and Wednesdays (game) each week.
- Students must attend practices and have a positive week in the classroom to be eligible to play in games.

**Please be aware that we will be in need of parent drivers who have completed criminal record checks and submitted driver's license information. This team is typically very large and if we can't all travel, none of us do.**

- Prevention and basic First Aid

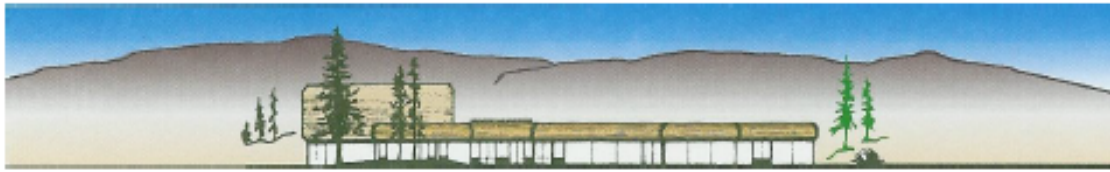
**HOME ALONE PROGRAM – 10 yrs +**

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### **We all play a part in creating a safe environment for Rose Valley students !**

Each member of our Learning Community has a responsibility in ensuring the safety of every Rose Valley student. Take care when driving or walking your children to and from school.

We are mindful that walking and driving conditions become more challenging with seasonal changes. Please prepare for unpredictable weather conditions and give yourself extra time for drop off and pick up.

### **Let's lead by example:**

- School Zone times are 7:30am – 5:00pm
- Use the new, clearly marked Cross-Walk
- Yield to pedestrians when entering and exiting the RVE drop off loop
- It is illegal to make U-turns in school zones (ie. on Westlake Rd.)
- Avoid parking vehicles on sidewalks, making it difficult for students walking to and from school.

### **When in residential areas, the following parking prohibitions apply when parking or stopping a vehicle. A vehicle must not be:**

- In front or within three metres of a public or private driveway
- On a crosswalk or within six metres of the approach side of a crosswalk
- Within 6 metres upon the approach to a stop sign or yield sign at the side of a roadway

### **RVE Parking and Drop Loops:**

#### **Bottom (bus) Loop**

- AM DROP OFF ONLY. NO IDLING. NO PARKING. Pull forward (YMCA entrance)
- PM PICK UP ONLY. PARK BUT PLEASE DON'T IDLE. WAIT BEHIND BUSES.
- AM and PM, please do not block blue bins / parking space. Cones indicate no parking.

#### **Top (portable) Loop AM and PM**

- AM Drop Off and PM Pick Up possible
- Do not block drive through loop. Please pull into an available parking space if needed

This area will become increasingly more crowded in the winter months, Sight lines and available space will be overtaken by piles of plowed snow. Please be careful.
